Within this plan, students will develop musicianship skills that will benefit not only their playing but their understanding of music in a broader sense as well. Students will be given the opportunity to learn about their instrument; they will improve on current skills and develop new ones. Students will also learn about the foundations of music and how it is written. They will develop critical listening skills and be able to make sound value judgments regarding musicality, expressiveness, and proficiency. Students will have the opportunity to take leadership roles in the band program by way of independent playing and conducting and possibly act as section head or leader. Students will compose music for their instrument and work with others to further their own understanding of the band around them. Finally, students will learn about music, its role in society, cultural connections, and how music of the past affects today. Through it all, students will come together and make music.
